- Jeff Davis (consultant) performed a presentation.
- Began by reminding us of what a Baseline Report is and the three different volumes
- After the baseline discussion, we'll talk about rolling out the roll out of the public engagement process.
- Reminder that April 15 is the first public forum.
- Population Growth
 - Slow but steady since 2000
 - o Manageable
- Age
 - o Chicopee is a rare case where average age has gone down (just slightly)
 - o 20-34 cohort is growing
- Race/Ethnicity
 - Increasing diversity
- Education
 - o Low education levels compared with rest of the state
 - Positive trends especially in high school graduation
- Households
 - Children declining slightly
 - Married with children is low
- Income and Poverty
 - Incomes up, but spending power has decreased significantly
 - Poverty levels higher (20%)
- Veterans
 - Almost 10% of adults are veterans
 - Veterans fair better than non-veterans except in the area of disability
- Disability
 - Higher than state average in all age groups
- Environmental Justice
 - o Relates to Equity as a concept
 - o Where are there high concentrations of people of color, low income, etc.
 - These groups are impacted disproportionately impacted by bad environmental conditions
- Land Use
 - Largely built out
 - HW is doing a build out analysis
 - o All the other plan elements feed into the land use discussion
- Housing
 - Property values are lower
 - o In the last year or so, we've achieved pre-recession levels
 - Data indicate high demand for rental
- Housing Affordability
 - Over 10% but losing over 800 units in less than 30 years

- Homelessness
 - 21 individuals recorded
 - o Zero shelters
- Labor Force
 - o 2.5 residents per job
 - Slower job growth
 - Unemployment higher than state, but similar to others in the region
 - o People commuting in and out for jobs. Mismatch.
- Employment
 - Retail and manufacturing
 - Despite loss of manufacturing jobs, still strong
- Commercial
 - Very low vacancies
- Leakage Analysis
- Transportation
 - o 90% drive alone to work
 - Nobody on bikes
 - o 30% over 55, so alternatives matter
 - Map of crash site
 - Good plans exist for bike network
 - Very low sidewalk occurrence
 - o CT River and Chicopee River walks
- Parking
 - Study shows low utilization
- Transit
 - 1% utilization
 - Expand rail service
 - Tie in all of the senior transit service from the senior center.
- Natural Resources
 - 1261 acres of conservation land
 - Floodplain will be a priority
- OS
- o 22% of land area
- A lot is unprotected
- Historic
 - 4 districts
 - o 9 registered structures
 - Better coordination and assistance required
- Climate Change
- Vulnerability/Resilience
- Food Insecurity/Food Alternatives
- Energy
 - Green Community certification

- Public Health Conditions
 - o Bay State Hospital Community Assessment
 - Cancer Rate
 - Asthma rates childhood versus adult
- Public Services
 - List of questions
 - o Town and school merged IT and custodial. Looking at HR as well.
